EMODnet for Marine Spatial Planning (MSP)

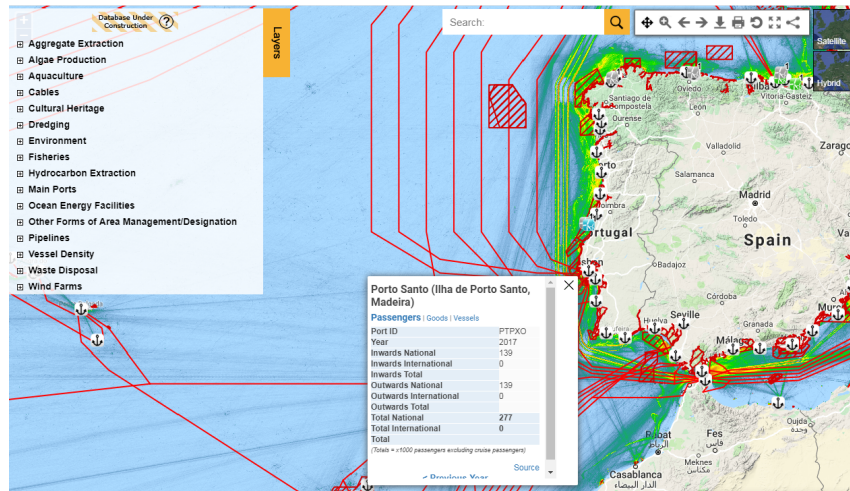


Figure –Map viewer from www.emodnet-humanactivities.eu displaying the wide range of human offshore activities

On the 3rd of October 2019, DG MARE and EASME organised an invited expert workshop on ‘Data for Marine Spatial Planning (MSP) implementation’ in Brussels. The objective of the workshop was to identify data needs and challenges for the MSP process beyond 2020, and to connect ongoing, finished and starting MSP related projects with EMODnet. **EMODnet is well aware of the supporting role it can play by providing data and data products relevant for the MSP practitioners.** At the same time, EMODnet should be the gateway to make data collected in the framework of the MSP process freely available. During the workshop, lessons learned on marine data requirements and exchange for MSP were shared from ongoing and recently completed MSP projects on regional cooperation between EU countries. Participating projects and EMODnet representatives agreed to follow up by continuing the dialogue through meetings and workshops and recommended establishment of an (in)formal working group on MSP data. Copernicus launches Blue Book "Copernicus for a Sustainable Ocean"



Published by Mercator Ocean International, implementer of the Copernicus Marine Service (CMEMS), the [Blue Book](#) is a report to inform all European citizens including policy-makers, students and youth, about the role the Copernicus Marine Service plays for the blue economy, for the environment and for society at large. Among its contributors are decision-makers,

entrepreneurs, experts, concerned citizens, and scientists from all over the world that are directly involved in ocean-related issues.

The Blue Book “Fostering knowledge on a sustainable ocean: what benefits for the EU?” was launched on 19 November 2019 at an event at the European Parliament by MEP Catherine Chabaud and MEP Cláudia Monteiro de Aguiar. European Commission DG MARE senior policy officer Iain Shepherd spoke on a panel, with colleagues from DG MARE, DG GROW, DG RTD and DG ENV also providing interventions.

EU Horizon 2020 Blue Cloud project starts in Pisa



On 2-4 October 2019, the EU Horizon 2020 Blue Cloud project kicked-off with a meeting in Pisa, Italy. This flagship project of the European Commission Directorate-General for Research and Innovation aims to connect and innovate Europe’s existing capability of marine data management and data services and to demonstrate the potential and future framework for a marine cloud service with virtual environments and collaborative online platforms. The European Marine Observation Data Network (EMODnet) is one of nine leading long-term infrastructures in Europe will be federated, including the SeaDataNet/SeaDataCloud and the Copernicus Marine Service and DIAS.

EMODnet partners are contributing to the project, among others by developing demonstrators and providing technical input and advice to the Blue Cloud architecture. The project will involve a large amount of stakeholder consultation to co-design a Roadmap to 2030 to deliver a sustainable blue cloud in the long-term as a marine component of the

European Open Science Cloud (EOSC). The project is funded under the Horizon 2020 BG-7 Future of Seas and Oceans call.
